Highlights

The group was able to see Blue Whales on two days with many Spinner Dolphins and also was lucky with a sighting of an Orca. A very close view of the Leopard at the eleventh hour made the tour very successful as we recorded 19 Mammals, 185 Birds and 8 Reptiles & other species.

Day 1

Saturday 6th February

Group members met at the airport and boarded a flight to Sri Lanka to start their tour.

Day 2

Sunday 7th February

The flight arrived at Colombo airport at 12.50pm, and we left the airport at 2.40pm. En-route we did a little birding from the bus and encountered Indian Pea Fowl, Black-headed Ibis, Purple Heron, Cattle Egret, Little Cormorant, Indian Cormorant, Brahminy Kite, Red-wattled Lapwing, House Swift, Indian Roller, White-throated Kingfisher, Sri Lanka Swallow, White-bellied Drongo, Red-vented Bulbul, Yellow-billed Babbler, Common Myna and Oriental Magpie Robin. We reached our hotel at 5.40pm and, after checking-in, everyone relaxed until 7pm when the leaders briefed the group on the activities for the next three days before going to dinner.

Day 3

Monday 8th February

We left the hotel at 6.30am with our picnic breakfast and were on our way in to the ocean by 7.15am. It was a very clear sunny day with ideal conditions for Whale watching. Our first encounter for the day was at around 8.30am where we witnessed a pod of around 50 Spinner Dolphins breaking the surface. Before long we saw our first Blue Whale which stayed with us for a very long time and displayed many tail up dives. After a very successful Whale watching session we returned to the pier at around 12 noon and en-route encountered Lesser Crested Tern, Greater Crested Tern, Common Tern, Little Tern, Whiskered Tern, White-winged Tern and Bridled Tern.

After the lunch we visited the Kirelakele forest where we encountered Lesser Whistling Duck, Garganey, Painted Stork, Eurasian Spoonbill, Indian Pond Heron, Great Egret, Intermediate Egret, Little Egret, Darter, White-bellied Sea Eagle, White-breasted Waterhen, Purple Swamphen, Black-winged Stilt, Spotted Redshank, Common Greenshank, Wood Sandpiper, Spotted Dove, Orange-breasted Green Pigeon, Green Imperial Pigeon, Rose-ringed Parakeet, Greater Coucal, Blue-tailed Bee-eater, Pied Kingfisher, Brown Shrike, Black-hooded Oriole, House Crow, Large-billed Crow, Paddyfield Pipit, Yellow-browed Bulbul, Common Tailorbird, Asian Paradise Flycatcher, Purple-rumped Sunbird, White-rumped Munia and Scaly-breasted Munia. Upon our return we did the checklist and, after the briefing for the next day, we finished the day with dinner.

Day 4

Tuesday 9th February

Once again we had tea/coffee at 6am and then left for the pier for our second day of whale watching. Once again we encounter a pod of around 50 Spinner Dolphins followed by the Blue Whale.

We returned to our hotel at 12.00pm for lunch, and then relaxed in the hotel. At 3.00pm we visited the Galle Fort and enjoyed the sights and sounds of the old fort city with its colonial architecture that stands strong to this day. At the fort we were able to witness Gull-billed Tern, Sooty Tern, Rock Pigeon, Indian Swiftlet, Asian Palm Swift and House Sparrow.

We were back at the hotel by 6pm and later did the checklist and briefing, followed by dinner.

Day 5

Wednesday 10th February

Today we had tea/coffee at 6.30am and reached the pier at 7.15am to board our boat. At around 8.40am we encountered an Orca (Killer Whale) and soon afterwards a huge pod of around 100-150 Spinner Dolphins which probably was trying to get away from the Orca we saw earlier. We were not able to spot any Blue Whales today probably due to the Orca's presence in the waters. .

We returned to the hotel by 12.30pm for lunch and relaxed till late evening enjoying the hotel facilities. At 4.00pm we did a little birding in the hotel premises and encountered Asian Openbill, Shikra, Asian Koel, Brown-headed Barbet, Coppersmith Barbet, Barn Swallow, Indian Blackbird, Asian Brown Flycatcher, Purple Sunbird, Loten's Sunbird and Oriental White Eye.

Once back at the hotel we did our checklist and, after the briefing, had our dinner.

Day 6

Thursday 11th February

After breakfast we checked out of the hotel at 8.30am and proceeded to Yala for our next three nights. En route we stopped near the Bundala National Park for some birding and encountered Grey Heron, Green Bee-eater, Common Iora, Sri Lanka Jungle Fowl and other birds.

We reached our next hotel by 2.00pm and had lunch. The group then relaxed until 4.30pm when we set out for a nature walk around the hotel premises where we see Knob-billed Duck, Pheasant-tailed Jacana, Little Ringed Plover, Kentish Plover, Lesser Sand Plover, Pin-tailed Snipe, Black-tailed Godwit, Common Red Shank, Marsh Sandpiper, Ruddy Turnstone, Yellow-crowned Woodpecker, Sri Lanka Woodshrike, Small Minivet, Yellow Wagtail, Grey Wagtail, Plain Prinia and Zitting Cisticola along with Wild Boar, Water Buffalo and Grey Langur.

We returned to the hotel by 6.00pm and did the checklist at 7pm followed by dinner.

Day 7

Friday 12th February

We left the hotel at 5.30am after tea/coffee for our first safari at Yala. We encountered Torque Macaque, Golden Jackal, Ruddy Mongoose, Indian Elephant, Wild Boar, Rock Python, Indian Cobra, Spotted Deer, Sambar, Water Buffalo, Grizzled Giant Squirrel along with Barred Buttonquail, Woolly-necked Stork, Spot-billed Pelican, Little Grebe, Gray-headed Fish Eagle, Oriental Honey Buzzard, Crested Serpent Eagle, Changeable Hawk Eagle, Great Thick Knee, Yellow-wattled Lapwing and many more birds.

At around 5.40pm as we were heading out of the park with no luck of a Leopard sighting we encountered one sleeping on a rock barely 15 meters away from us. There were only 10 jeeps and everyone was able to spend a good 20 minutes looking at the sleeping king of the Yala Park.

We were in the hotel by 6.30pm and since it was long day we skipped the checklist and had dinner and called it a day.

Day 8

Saturday 13th February

We started the day with a pre-breakfast birding session around the hotel premises and encountered Indian Pitta, Black-necked Stork, Lesser Adjutant, Pacific Golden Plover, Green Sandpiper, Sanderling, Little Stint, Caspian Tern, Malabar Pied Hornbill and Indian Silverbill. After breakfast the group relaxed in the hotel and enjoyed a dip in the pool. We had lunch at 12.30pm and then set out for the afternoon safari in to the Yala Park and encounter many birds and mammals seen the previous day. We were not luck with the Leopard and the Sloth Bear today.

We returned to the hotel at 6.30pm and did the checklist followed by dinner.

Day 9

Sunday 14th February

We left the hotel at 8.30am after breakfast and proceeded to Colombo via Tissamaharama. During our journey we encountered a colony of Flying fox, Water Monitor, Land Monitor, Rat Snake and many birds.

At 1.30pm we reached Ratnapura and had lunch in a local restaurant after which the group separated in to two and one lot proceeded to Sinharaja for their birding extension while the other lot travelled to Colombo for their last night's stay at the Airport Garden hotel.

The birding extension group reached Sinharaja at 4.15pm and after a hot cup of tea did a bit of birding around the hotel premises where they encountered Mountain Hawk Eagle, Sri Lanka Hanging Parrot, Plum-headed Parakeet, Layard's Parakeet, Stork-billed Kingfisher, Crimson-fronted Barbet, Lesser Goldenback, Golden-fronted Leafbird, Black Bulbul, Tawny-bellied Babbler, Sri Lanka Hill Myna and Pale-billed Flowerpecker.

We did the checklist at 7.00pm followed by dinner.

Day 10

Monday 15th February

We had early breakfast at 6.15am and proceeded to the Sinharaja rainforest where we encountered Sri Lanka Green Pigeon, Alexandrine Parakeet, Red-faced Malkoha, Malabar Trogon, Yellow-fronted Barbet, Scarlet Minivet, Sri Lanka Blue Magpie, Sri Lanka Drongo, Black-capped Bulbul, Brown-capped Babbler, Dark-fronted Babbler, Orange-billed Babbler, Ashy-headed Laughingthrush, White-faced Starling, Sri Lanka Scaly Thrush, Tickell's Blue Flycatcher and Legge's Flowerpecker. We also see a Green Pit Viper and a Green Vine Snake.

We returned to the hotel at 2.30pm and relaxed before going on another birding walk around the Sinharaja village.

We were back in the hotel by 6.00pm and did our checklist at 7.00pm followed by dinner.

Day 11

Tuesday 16th February

After a cup of tea/coffee we left the hotel in jeeps to the Ketalapatala area where we encountered the shy and elusive Sri Lanka Spurfowl and the Green-billed Coucal. We returned to the hotel at 8.00am and had breakfast

and relaxed until 12.00pm. We had lunch and again set out to the Sinharaja rainforest. We encountered Black Eagle, Sri Lanka Frogmouth, Brown-capped Pygmy Woodpecker, Lesser Yellownape, Crimson-backed Goldenback, Black-naped Monarch, Sri Lank Scimitar Babbler, Spot-winged Thrush and Indian Blue Robin.

We returned to the hotel at 4.00pm and did our usual evening routine with the checklist followed by dinner.

Day 12

Wednesday 17th February

At 7.00am we did a pre breakfast birding session around the village area and returned to the hotel at 8.00am. Few of the clients took a dip in the nearby river and were at leisure till lunch at 12.00pm.

We checked out of the hotel at 1.15pm and proceeded to Colombo and reached the next hotel at 4.30pm. At 5.00pm we did a little birding in the hotel garden and concluded the day with the checklist and dinner at 7.00pm.

Day 13

Thursday 18th February

After breakfast, we left the hotel at 9.45am and went to the airport for our flight back to the UK, where another Naturetrek adventure came to an end.
