Highlights

This tour delivered wonderful sightings of Blue Whales & Leopards multiple times, in addition to the other abundant wildlife of Sri Lanka. We were fortunate enough to see three different types of whales that included a rare Fin Whale, a Sperm Whale, and Blue Whale along with Spinner Dolphins.

Our search for Leopards was also fruitful as we enjoyed close encounters with one of the cats in Lunugamvehera National Park. We were able to see Asian Elephants, Spotted Deer, Golden Jackal, Mugger Crocodiles and many bird species were amongst the mix of wildlife we had the joy of seeing.

Overall we had sightings of 22 species of Mammals, 139 species of Birds, 16 Reptiles and Amphibians and 64 species of Butterflies.

Day 1

Saturday 16th November

The tour started with an overnight flight from the UK to Sri Lanka.

Day 2

Sunday 17th November

Arrive Colombo; travel to Koggala

The group was welcomed at the Airport at 1.20 pm by the leaders before setting off to Weligama for our three-night stay at Koggala Beach Hotel.

During our journey to the hotel we encountered Indian Peafowl, Black-headed Ibis, Indian Grey Heron, Intermediate Egret, Little Egret, Black-winged Kite, White-throated Kingfisher, Brahminy Kite, House Crow, Kite, Great Egret, Little Cormorant, Crested Hawk-eagle, Indian Palm Squirrel and Common House Gecko.

We reached the Koggala Beach Hotel at 5.30pm. We met for our evening briefing and checklist before having our dinner and retiring for the night.

Day 3

Monday 18th November

Koggala to Mirissa

We left the hotel at 6.00am with our packed breakfasts and reached Mirissa harbour at 6.40am in plenty of time for the boat's departure at 7.00am. We saw our first Blue Whale two hours into the trip and we managed to follow this whale for a while until we had enough sightings.

We returned to the hotel at 12.45 pm for lunch and then had time to relax before our afternoon excursion.

During our visit to the Kirala Kele sanctuary we encountered Striated Heron, Indian Pond Heron, Eastern Cattle Egret, Darter, White-breasted Waterhen, Purple Swamphen, Red-wattled Lapwing, Whiskered Tern, Asian Palm

Swift, Blue-tailed Bee-eater, Sri Lanka Red-backed Woodpecker, Common Iora, Common Kingfisher, Yellow Bittern, Brown Shrike, Black-hooded Oriole, White-bellied Drongo, Large-billed Crow, Red-vented Bulbul, White-browed Bulbul, Barn Swallow, Plain Prinia, Common Myna and Purple-rumped Sunbird,

We returned to the hotel at 6.30pm and had dinner at 7.15 pm and did the checklist and the briefing for the next day.

Day 4

Tuesday 19th November

Koggala to Mirissa

Another morning whale watching excursion yielded fantastic views of a Fin Whale - a rare species in Mirissa waters, and we were also very lucky to see a pod of Spinner Dolphins which happened to cruise along our boat. After another very successful morning of Whale Watching we returned to the hotel for our lunch and relaxed until late afternoon.

Our visit to the Galle Fort took us back to the colonial past of the island as we traversed through the forts narrow roads surrounded by Portuguese, Dutch and British architecture of a bygone era.

Upon returning to the hotel we did our checklist and had dinner before calling it a night.

Apart from the many sea creatures, today we were also able to see birds such as Greater Crested Tern, Spotted Dove, Indian Swiftlet, Rose-ringed Parakeet, Yellow-billed Babbler and Oriental Magpie-Robin.

Day 5

Wednesday 20th November

Koggala to Mirissa

We left the hotel early with our packed breakfast for our final whale watching session and were able to see another pod of Spinner Dolphins. Afterwards we were able to see a Sperm Whale and we followed it for a while until we had good sightings. We sailed further out to deeper water and were thrilled to see an adult Blue Whale around 10.00am. We came back to the hotel for a late lunch and rested for a while. Later in the afternoon we visited a turtle hatchery and observed the Logger-head, Green, Hawksbill & Olive Ridley Turtles who are cared for at the hatchery.

We were back in the hotel at 6.30 pm and our usual routine of checklist and dinner followed.

Day 6

Thursday 21st November

Koggala to Yala

We had our breakfast at 7.30am before checking out of the hotel and leaving for Yala. We reached the perimeter of Bundala National Park where we did some birding as well. During our journey we enjoyed sightings of many birds. We reached the Cinnamon Wild hotel for a late lunch.

In the afternoon we did a bird walk around the hotel premises and we saw many bird species such as Lesser Whistling Duck, Painted Stork, Spot-billed Pelican, Asian Openbill, Woolly-necked Stork, Common Moorhen,

Pin-tailed Snipe, Orange-breasted Green Pigeon, Green Imperial Pigeon, Green Bee-eater, Purple Sunbird, Forest Wagtail and Paddyfield Pipit.

Apart from the many birds we were also able to see Grey Langur, Wild Boar, Water Buffalo, Bengal Land Monitor, Oriental Garden Lizard and Marsh Mugger Crocodile which was amusing to see as it was in close proximity to our hotel garden!

Day 7

Friday 22nd November

Yala to Lunugamvehera

We left the hotel at 5.00 am after tea/coffee and travelled towards Lunugamvehera National Park. On the way we were able to see a Golden Jackal right in front of our bus walking along the road. We entered the park at 6.30am encountering many birds as well as other species. We were following many alarm calls trying to track a Leopard, which paid off when it finally appeared from the thick shrubs after making its way to the other side of the road, surprising us all by crossing right in front of our jeep.

Throughout the day we were able to see many birds such as Sri Lanka Junglefowl, Lesser Adjutant, Great Cormorant, Osprey, Crested Honey Buzzard, Crested Hawk Eagle, White-bellied Sea Eagle, Grey-headed Fish Eagle, Crested Treeswift, House Swift, Indian Roller, Pied Kingfisher, Malabar Pied Hornbill, Jerdon's Bush Lark, Sri Lanka Swallow and Indian Robin.

We returned to the hotel at 6.30 pm and on the way we were lucky to see a massive male Elephant on the side of the road which was often seen begging for food from passing vehicles.

Apart from the many birds we were also able to see Torque Macaque, Ruddy Mongoose, Stripe-necked Mongoose, Spotted Deer, Sambar, Indian Hare, Green Garden Lizard and Common Skink.

We returned to the hotel after a very successful safari and once again met up for the checklist at dinner at 7.45pm.

Day 8

Saturday 23rd November

Yala

Once again we left the hotel at 5.30am after tea/coffee for our safari to Yala National Park. Our sightings today included Black-necked Stork, Eurasian Spoonbill, Barred Buttonquail, Black-winged Stilt, Pacific Golden Plover, Common Ringed Plover, Lesser Sand Plover, Pheasant-tailed Jacana, Little Stint, Gull-billed Tern, Chestnut-headed Bee-Eater, Hoopoe, Brown-capped Pygmy Woodpecker, Common Kestrel, Asian Paradise Flycatcher, Ashy-crowned Sparrow-Lark, Oriental Skylark, Grey-breasted Prinia, Jungle Prinia, Common Tailorbird, Dark-fronted Babbler, Brahminy Starling, Loten's Sunbird, Baya Weaver, Indian Silverbill, Scally-breasted Munia and Black-headed Munia.

Mammals were plentiful and included Asian Elephant, Water Buffalo, Spotted Deer, Toque Macaque, Grey Langur, Sambar, Sri Lanka Leopard and Golden Jackal, while a Common Rat Snake was also seen.

We returned to the hotel after a very successful safari and once again met up for the checklist and dinner at 8.00pm.

Main Tour Day 9; Extension Day 1

Sunday 24th November

Katunayake (Main Tour); Sinharaja (Extension)

We had breakfast at 8am and checked out of the hotel at 9am heading for Ratnapura, where we reached the Nivahana Restaurant at 12.30 pm and had our lunch. On the way we did some birding at Debarawewa and encountered a colony of Indian Flying Fox and Brown Fish Owl. Afterwards we split up as eight members of the group were going to Sinharaja for the bird watching extension, while the rest set off to Katunayake for their final night's stay.

The main group reached the Airport Garden Hotel at 7.30 pm and enjoyed a leisurely dinner. Meanwhile, the Extension party reached the Blue Magpie Lodge at 5.45pm. We later met for the checklist and dinner at 7.30pm

Throughout the day we saw many birds including Brown Fish Owl and Lesser Hill Myna along with an Asian Water Monitor.

Main Tour Day 10; Extension Day 2

Monday 25th November

Return to UK (Main Tour); Sinharaja (Extension)

After breakfast the Main Tour group checked out of the hotel and proceeded to the airport in time for their return flight to the UK, where their Naturetrek adventure came to an end.

The Extension party left their hotel at 6.00am with a packed lunch. Our birding session in the rainforest encountered Sri Lanka Green Pigeon, Green-billed Coucal, Sri Lanka Frogmouth, Malabar Trogon, Yellow-fronted Barbet, Crimson-fronted Barbet, Small Minivet, Black-naped Monarch, Sri Lanka Blue Magpie, Yellow-browed Bulbul, Orange-billed Babbler, Velvet-fronted Nuthatch, Spot-winged Thrush, Brown-breasted Flycatcher and White-rumped Munia.

Purple-faced Leaf Monkey, Grizzled Giant Squirrel, Dusky Striped Squirrel along with the Sri Lanka Kangaroo Lizard, Sri Lanka Green Pit Viper, Green Vine Snake, Giant Milipede and Giant Wood Spider were also encountered during our journey.

After a long day in the rainforest we returned to the hotel and enjoyed a well-deserved hot cup of tea before meeting up for our usual evening routine.

Extension Day 3

Tuesday 26th November

Sinharaja

Once again we left our hotel at 6.00 am on our early morning visit to the Sinharaja rainforest and we had good sightings of Black Eagle, Red-faced Malkoha, Layard's Parakeet, Sri Lanka Hanging Parrot, Sri Lanka Drongo, Square-tailed Bulbul, Sri Lanka Scimitar Babbler, Ashy-headed Laughingthrush, Crested Serpent Eagle, Sri Lanka

White-Eye, Sri Lanka Hill Myna, White-faced Starling and Pale-billed Flowerpecker . The Checkered Keelback Snake was the only snake we came across today.

In the evening we did the checklist at 7pm, followed by a briefing and dinner.

Extension Day 4

Wednesday 27th November

Katunayake

Another morning bird watching session around the village area yielded sightings of Plum-headed Parakeet, Black-headed Cuckooshrike, White-browed Fantail, Black-capped Bulbul, Golden-fronted Leafbird, Legge's Flowerpecker and Black-throated Munia, Bar-winged Flycatcher-shrike, Oriental White-eye, and White-rumped Munia. After lunch we checked out of the hotel and proceeded to Katunayake where we reached the Gateway Airport Garden Hotel at 3.30pm and proceeded with the usual evening routine.

Apart from the many birds we found a Hard Shelled Terrapin.

Extension Day 5

Thursday 28th November

Return flights

We checked out of the hotel and travelled to the airport in time for our return flights home at the end of an excellent holiday in this beautiful country.
